Since 2004 lecturer at the Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts. Since 2010 writing courses at the Literaturhaus Basel and for the Volkshochschule Basel.

Member of the Judging Panel of the International IMPAC Dublin Literary Award 2009. 2017 - 2020 member of the programme committee of the Solothurn Literary Days. Member of the AdS - Autoren der Schweiz and president of the PEN Centre of German Speaking Writers Abroad.
